he 2 full-day Global Scientific Summit will showcase the current understanding about how exposure to violence or abuse impacts our health. New research is yielding important insights into the connection between exposure to violence and abuse with long-term health consequences, providing unprecedented opportunity for new advancements in health care. This meeting provides a forum to better understand how clinicians, educators, researchers and advocates are addressing the complex challenges of addressing violence and abuse within the health care setting.

This meeting is intended for health care professionals, students and trainees from multiple disciplines, including behavioral health, counseling, dentistry, family therapy, medicine, nursing, nutrition, pharmacy, physical and occupational therapy, psychology, public health, and social work. AVA is particularly interested in providing an academic forum for those working to systematically address different forms of abuse in unique clinical settings, improve teaching and prevention of all forms of violence and abuse across the lifespan.


