

**Kenneth Feldman, MD**  
Child Abuse Pediatrician, Retired

Kenneth Feldman, MD is a general pediatrician who divided his time between primary care pediatrics and child abuse consultation. He was in primary care practice since 1974 and a child abuse consultant since 1983. He saw his own primary care patients until July 2019 and supervised a Continuity Clinic in the same primary care office, the Odessa Brown Children's Clinic till 2023. He was twice acting medical director at the same clinic.

He was Medical Director of the Seattle Children's Protection Program from 1983 until July 2010. He retired in July 2024 as a child abuse consultant with the program. He previously supervised care on the PICU, wards and in the Emergency Department at Seattle Children's. He is a Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Washington and a member of the General Pediatric Division (retired).

He is a former Executive Committee member of the AAP's Section on Child Abuse and Neglect and of the Helfer Society. He is the recipient of the 2008 Ray Helfer Award of the Helfer Society. He received the AAP SOCAN/COCAN 2016 Award for Outstanding Service to Maltreated Children. He received the AAP Practitioner Research Award in 1991 for his research on tap water burn injuries.

Dr. Feldman is boarded in Pediatrics and Child Abuse Pediatrics (Retired in good standing). Research interests have focused on childhood injuries, both unintentional and inflicted. Tap water burn injuries have been an area of continuing interest.
