MBF's mission is to provide the best, comprehensive **prevention education programs** to protect children from abuse, bullying, and many other types of victimization.


Since 2010, MBF programs have been taught to more than 9 million children across the U.S. and in 6 additional countries. 
MBF Programs: Topics Covered



Prevention Works!

Children involved in school-based prevention programs were:

- ✓ more likely to use the school-taught self-protection strategies when victimized or threatened;
- ✓ more likely to feel they were successful in protecting themselves, and;
- ✓ more likely to disclose to someone about the victimization attempts.

EXAMPLE:

MBF Child Safety Matters Implementation by Kristi House

- 2,450 K-5 students from Miami-DCPS January 2018-March 2020
- Positive outcomes regardless of gender or grade level
- 4 disclosures of child sexual abuse
- 1 report of physical abuse
- Parent shared program information with Seacamp in Florida Keys



Expansion

Located in Panama City, Florida with satellite offices in Marianna and Chipley serving 6 counties.

Selected and partnered with MBF

Community Outreach Program began October 1, 2016, with one outreach advocate and has expanded to a team of five advocates serving five counties.

2016

1,209 children received the program

2017

6,969 children received the program

2019

26,315 children received the program

Protecting Children, Strengthening Families

2020

20,077 children received the program

2022

29, 747 children received the program (170 disclosures)
